
Thank you for all the donated Silent Auction items... and to those that purchased them! The auction brought in \$408.




Election Results • New Board of Director Terms for 2017

Additional topics from the General Membership Meeting of November 19, 2016—

- **Show Bill:** Discussion on adding or removing classes and break times. The General Membership voted to LEAVE our show bill Classes as they are for 2017. Also to add 30 minute break times between classes 44 & 45 and 69 & 70.
- **Point Sharing:** Discussion on point sharing with another club for Year End Points. <u>The General</u> Membership voted by paper ballot... Results: NO Point sharing for 2017.
- **By-Laws:** Discussion on the proposed amendment sent to all members in the Fall Newsletter. <u>The General Membership voted to amend Article VI—Section II, Section III and Section IV as suggested.</u>

Topics from the General Membership Meeting of November 19, 2016 continued—

- Show Staff: Teri Nielsen will be our Show Secretary in 2017, with Holly Justin as her assistant. New show program software has been purchased. Our old program had many glitches! 

**We can not stress enough how important it is follow us on social media... our Website and Facebook, attend General Membership Meetings AND read your Newsletters to keep informed.

• Is there another facility besides Hinckley... the majority circled "No". Some comments: "Solve issues there... improve lighting... fill holes in stalls... dislike Hinckley... Red Horse... Windom... Move things around the state... Northwest Saddle Club... Cannon Falls... Verndale... Winona... Verndale is bad... Verndale has a nice facility but No hotels close by, everything has a downside...

Information-

- Red Horse is not an option. It is closed for hosting any horse shows.
- Northwest Saddle Club Arena is an outdoor arena, with a small indoor. There are limited stalls that would not be able to accommodate our members.
- We *are* technically a club of the North, that's how we received our Regional Club status from APHA. Granted, that does not mean we are beholden to activities only in our jurisdiction BUT we also want to respect MPHA. They hold their shows at Winona and Cannon Falls.
- Verndale had comments both positive and negative. Our numbers began to decline show after show last we were in Verndale. If the majority of our members would be committed to going there, it could make a difference. Availability would be the next thing, as our weekends have not always been open and/or they are booked out for a couple years.
- Hinckley has it's issues as every venue does, but have made many improvements and continue to do so. They have also treated our club very well. Starting with the reduced tack stall rate. No other venue does this, they charge the same full price as a horse stall. Along with this, in 2015, they sponsored the grooming towels that were given out to the exhibitors. In 2016, they gave our club \$1,000.00 Sponsorship. These are huge donations and benefits you don't see from any other venue.

• Add or Remove Classes... Comments: "Not at this time... No I like it... good show bill now... like what we have... it's good... 2 YR Old Longe Line... Remove Ranch Horse... Add Youth Reining and Youth Western riding... Cut classes that do not have entries or at least a 1/2 point class... too many... too many SPB... Walk Trot Trail... Add additional Lead Line classes... Youth Walk Trot Trail... Add ideal Paint... Eliminate or combine Weanling, Yearling, 2 YR Old and 3 YR Old... more Walk Trot Classes for Youth... Tandem Bareback... Masters Amateur Classes."

Information—

- The show bill class line up is decided and voted on by the General Membership at our 4th Quarterly Meeting for each up coming year.
- For classes with "no" entries, the general consensus the members make is "they don't cost us to be on the show bill...OR ...the class is available if it draws new people to our show... OR... it may bring exhibitors that need to qualify in that event for the World Show. If the class has zero entries, it will not hold up the show."
- Some classes mentioned in the survey, are not APHA approved classes... additional Lead Line Classes and Tandem Bareback. In the future, maybe APHA will make a lead Line Division and add classes. If the majority of our members desire, we could still offer those classes, however...there is a specific way these classes must be judged. Not all APHA Judges have had this training. It would limit us to hiring only Pinto Approved Judges.
- More Youth Walk Trot Classes: there are only two classes in the Division that we do not already offer, Trail and Working Hunter Over Fences. Trail is an option to add, but if you want it... We need you at the General Membership Meeting when classes are added and approved.
- Eliminating or combine Weanling, Yearling, 2 YR and 3 YR Old... we do not have Weanling classes on our show bill, as they are not APHA National point earning classes. Combining of these classes is up to the exhibitors participating. They are generally point earning classes in which those exhibitors all pay entry fees and want their horses judged too.
- SPB Classes: Our show for these classes is minimal compared to all the Divisions. The SPB Youth classes are not broke down by ages and we offer NO Novice Youth or Novice Amateur. It is a shout out to MNSPHC for "our" SPB exhibitors listed in the point standings with the Paint Horse Journal. We're proud to support those horses too. See our announcement below about the SPB Super Horse of the Year for 2017!
- More Social Activities... Majority said "Yes". Some of the comments: Love social stuff... anything it's fun, brings people together... what we had, pizza party was fun... definitely have these activities, but have them on Saturday so all exhibitors can participate, by having on Friday it excludes those who work all day and get to the show late... Youth ice cream party...Hot dogs... Pot luck... Difficult as the shows run so long... Maybe early morning Sunday Breakfast... Beverages in warm up pen... BBQ... Saturday evening get together... Host evening meals sponsor based ie trainer barn/group of people...Taco Party... Tobies Cinnamon Rolls... Offer sponsored dinners by exhibitors and or trainers...

Information—

- Keep this in mind... on Saturdays & Sundays we bring a food vendor in. It's very difficult to find food vendors willing to come —
 We have to guarantee them a sales amount for the day.
 We do ask that members will patronize the vendors so that there is no additional cost to the club.
- We can not hold a club Pot Luck or Social event while the show is going on... exhibitors are still showing and members are still working the show. Saturday evening "club socials or pot luck" could end up starting very late.
- If there are people that would like to volunteer and form a committee for Social Activities... Awesome! Please contact a Board Member with your interest.

Survey Continued—

• Share points with another club... Majority answered "No". Some of the comments: MPHA... Iowa... NWPHC... WI... State Fair... Unless the Florida Paint Horse Club in the Winter!... Maybe but be careful... in the future... no out of state clubs... Maybe if the other club shows it starts to grow again... if we can support WI, we should be able to support another MN club.

Information— The sharing of points is decided by the General Membership at our 4th Quarterly Meeting. It's done by Ballot vote. The result from November 2016 was "No" point sharing for 2017. History: 2017 will be the first year we have not shared points with NWPHC or any other club.

- Other Suggestions... Some of the comments and Information—
- Give All-Around Awards... Need All-Arounds

Information—In January of 2016, the General Membership voted to incorporate All-Around Titles in to our Awards Program. The award was to be certificates, unless we came up with Sponsorship funds directed to those awards. The information was on our Website, on Facebook, and in the Newsletter. Sheets were at the shows with a break down of the specific classes each Division had to qualify in. The Newsletter last Fall, also had a separate section listing all winners for All-Around.

• Get rid of Super Horses... Not a fan of Super Horse, because it's less about the horse and more about how many people show it (it's a plus if you have a youth exhibitor and disadvantage if you don't) Maybe it should be a Super Horse Show Family Award.

Information— The Super Horse of the Year is a prestigious High Point All-Around title. This award has been given out for the past 3 years. Three different people have won it, ALL exhibiting the horse themselves, that is ALL points were accumulated from ONE exhibitor. What is the Halter Horse of the Year? The High Point Halter Horse. To make this award fair, we broke it down and added a Youth Halter Horse of the Year, so those with a Youth did not have an advantage over others. In 2016, we gave the Open/Amateur Halter award to 2 horses because there was a misunderstanding of the rule wording ... Now the ruling is clearly stated to prevent it from happening again. The Super Horse Titles are a "brand" of our own, making us different from any other club. To date, all these awards have been sponsored... which is awesome! Also tells us the sponsors like them too.

SPB Horses...

Information—We are about promoting the Paint Horse. Solid Paint Bred Horses are a big part of the American Paint Horse Association. Many of these horses are not coming to the Breed Shows, they're either left at home or showing WSCA. Why? Because many clubs have left them by the wayside and are not offering them anything. MNSPHC can proudly say "We're not one of those clubs and support them also." For 2017, SPB Super Horse of the Year has been added to our awards program. We hope this can be another way of reaching out to those exhibitors to come join us.

Shorten class length for less entries... no matter what size the class is, each exhibitor has paid an entry fee and waited for their class to come up. The Judges know their requirements to judge the class... for those horses to move in both directions or go through the pattern just as a larger class.

More arena time during lunch... Our show bill has a 30 minute lunch break. Prolonging the lunch break for more arena time, prolongs the show. At the July show, on Saturday during lunch there was a Youth Fundraiser Costume Class... asked for by the Youth. This did take up arena time. It's hard... there's a lot of people to accommodate. At the same time, everybody wants the show to get over sooner and they want fun fundraiser classes.

Kid craft and activity table... Is there somebody willing to take this on? A group or barn or individuals to set it up, over see if needed and be responsible for clean-up?

Survey Continued—

Higher recognition of Youth— Lead Line & Walk Trot, pass out rosette ribbons... thoughts for the General Membership to go over. We try to keep our entry fees down and have not raised any fees in several years. For the past couple years, we've had Members/Trainers/Barns that have donated all the Lead Line prize bags to give to each exhibitor. There's also been discussion on giving something out to the Youth Walk Trot exhibitors at the show, but what can be difficult is they have several classes. Rosette ribbons are nice, but expensive... it's a hard line to draw for who would be entitled.

Complimentary drink tickets should be given to all members, not just for those paying for meals. We all spend \$ with the club through out the year... We have given a complimentary drink ticket at the banquet to those that purchase a meal as a perk for joining the group. Without meals, we would have to pay for the facility. People that pay for meals, get us the room. We also have "non-members" that come to the banquet, Spouses, Grandparents, additional family and friends... not just members.

Better Judges and Show Staff... Our Judges are all APHA approved judges who we pay for an opinion. It doesn't matter who is hired... some exhibitors love them, some complain. We have hired some of the most respected names available, we still had complaints. Now they won't come back. It's not an easy job and we thank the Judge's Committee for all the hard work getting them lined up. Qualified Show Secretaries are hard to come by also. It didn't help us last year working with an out-dated show program. It caused a lot of issues and extra work for several people. Hopefully that will all be solved this year... we're excited about the new show program and thankful Teri Nielsen and Holly Justin are taking this task on.

Club seems to have a Halter BOD and seems to brush off performance horses... the membership decides the show bill line up.

We have 123 classes, 28 of them are Halter. We award Grand, Reserve and Top 5 titles for every qualifying class. Additional

Titles and recognition are given... All-Around titles, (11) of them, both a Grand & Reserve. Super Horse of the Year and now SPB

Super Horse of the Year. That makes for (24) special award titles up and above Grand and Reserve for performance horses.

Halter horses have (2) Special Awards. Halter horse exhibitors contribute a large portion of the individual class fee revenue the club receives from the shows. They do not qualify for All-day fee discounts. MNSPHC has stepped out of the box from the rest of the clubs so those horses/members may be honored too.

Club is run too much by the Board, Don't have Quarterly Meetings, Keep the membership involved in decision making...

All major decisions that impact our club are done and have been done at the General Membership Meetings. In 2016, there was a General Membership meeting in the 1st Quarter and the 4th Quarter. As required, all members are notified when and where the General membership Meetings will take place. MNSPHC By-Law Article III, specifically states what the (10) responsibilities and concerns are for the Board of Directors in conducting our club.

• Is there anything you would like to be more involved with and want to volunteer... The majority answered "No". There were (2) answers for "Yes" but did not leave any contact information.
